Kenji Miyata *Pyracantha Bonsai*

On Monday evening, Mr. Miyata will present a lecture/demonstration on training Pyracantha Bonsai.

Mr. Miyata is currently a resident artist at New England Bonsai Gardens in Bellingham, Massachusetts for six months out of the year. The rest of the year he travels back to Japan and other parts of this country demonstrating, teaching classes and giving private tutorials.

He began his study of bonsai at the age of 15 after quitting high school to formally study bonsai. He then studied at the Daiju-en Bonsai Garden of Toshinori Suzuki for a short time before going to study with Masamitsu Kubota in Kyushu. This led to many more avenues of study for this determined student. In 1977 he opened his own business, the Miyata-en Bonsai Garden.

The bonsai he creates will be raffled at the conclusion of the meeting. Make sure your dues are paid up before the meeting to avoid paying a \$10 admission charge for non members. Don't miss this opportunity to learn from a gifted Japanese bonsai artist.

Club Policies

Library Policy:

Members are responsible for insuring that the books they check out are checked in by the librarian when they are returned.

All books are due at the meeting subsequent to the one at which the book was checked out

There will be a \$1.00 per month for each overdue book and anyone with a book overdue or who has not paid the overdue fine will not be eligible to check out any other books or tapes.

If a book is not returned by the third meeting after being checked out, the person who checked the book out will be billed for the replacement cost.

All books are due at the June picnic and no books are to be taken out over the summer.

Fines collected will go into a library fund to pay library expenses and buy new books and tapes. A book is overdue immediately after the meeting at which it is due. This is because the rest of the members will not have access to that book until the next meeting.

Recording Club Events:

There will be no audio or video taping of any club sponsored events. The club itself reserves the right to record some special events with permission of those participating.

Paid workshops:

Reservations for paid workshops are confirmed when payment is received. Workshop fees are not refundable, but members who have paid but cannot attend may sell their reservation to other members. (The society usually has a waiting list)

Guests Welcome:

Members of other bonsai clubs, guests of members and other interested people who are not members of BSUNY are welcome to attend our meetings and enjoy our programs from time to time. When we have out of town speakers, non-members are asked to pay a fee to help defray the expenses of the program. Anyone who wishes to attend the meetings on a regular basis should become a regular dues paying member.

Members sales at Meetings:

Members may bring pre-bonsai plants, pots and other supplies for sale at club meetings. No trained bonsai please. You must set yourself up at a table and arrange to have yourself or someone handy to deal with customers. The club asks for 10% of the sales.

Conifer Society To Meet In Rochester

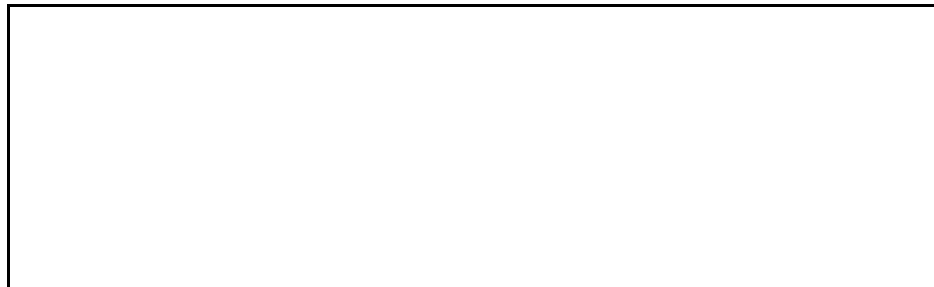

The meeting consists of a dinner, tours of gardens in Rochester, a banquet and a tale gate plant sale. Our society will present a special exhibit of "Conifer Bonsai" during the two day event. It's That Time Of Year Again...

It's about time to start thinking about bringing tender bonsai indoors for the winter. I've been thinking about it all summer long, but it is still too early to bring them inside. Keep tender bonsai outdoors as long as possible without getting hit by a frost. It is a good idea to bring them inside for an evening when frost is expected, then put them outside again. The longer you keep them outdoors, the healthier they will be. When it is finally time to bring the tender indoor species in for the winter, don't forget to spray for pests. Remember to provide all the light possible. It is often beneficial to supplement with cool white florescent bulbs. Cool temperatures (45 - 60 F) are better than warm for most species. Extra humidity can be provided with trays filled with gravel (white marble chips if you want to be fancy) and water. Feeding should be reduced or eliminated for plants to be kept indoors for the winter. Over wintering care sheets will be available at the September meeting. Continue to fertilize your hardy, outdoor bonsai on a regular schedule, as you have been doing all summer, until late September or early October. I continue to feed with a high Nitrogen fertilizer on a weekly schedule, especially on fruiting species. This is a good time to check the training wire on your bonsai, too, as the trunks might be getting fat and the wire may cut into the bark. Enjoy your bonsai during the last few weeks of summer. You know what is coming, because **it's that time of the year.....**
